All submissions will be refereed. Abstracts of the papers should have no more than 400 words in length and can be provided in English, French, or Spanish. Abstracts should be submitted as an attached MS Word document to secoord@uvic.ca, with cc Rafael.Chaves@uv.es, indicating in the Subject Line: "CIRIEC 2007 – ABS – Authorname", for example. "CIRIEC 2007 – ABS – Jose Luis Monzon". The attached document must be named "ABS –Authorname – CIRIEC 2007.doc". Submissions that do not contain the required information will be sent back to the authors.
